

WHAT IS ICL?



Implantable Collamer Lenses, the Staar ICL and the IOC IPCL are micro-thin lenses placed inside the eye to correct short-sightedness (myopia), far-sightedness (hyperopia) and astigmatism.



Is the procedure painful?

No! you might have a mild sensation for a moment during surgery, but it is not painful.

How long does the surgery take?

Around 10-15 minutes for an eye. An anesthetic drop is put into the eye to make it painfree.



How long do I need to take a leave from work?



You can resume your work after 2-3 days. If you work on a computer or in a dusty surrounding then it will take more days.

What is the success and safety rate for the ICL surgery?

More than 96% of people undergoing these procedures can avoid wearing glasses.



What numbers can ICL surgery correct?

Plus numbers from +0.50 to +10.00 and minus numbers from -0.50 to -20.00, along with cylindrical powers upto 6.00 dioptres can be corrected.
